## **Changes to Remedy 2024-25 onward**


Effective this school year, BCPSEA is instructing school districts to implement the Jackson award. (SD#53 had not implemented this arbitration award during the past 4 years.)

### What is the Jackson Award?

In 2019, Arbitrator Marguerite Jackson issued an award finding that references to special education designation categories in restored teacher collective language <u>held the meanings attributed to them at</u> the time the language was removed.

The Jackson Award particularly impacted current designations G & Q (Category G = Autism Category Q = Learning Disabilities)

SOSTU contract never had Category Q counting for composition purposes



In 2002, when the restored language was removed, Category G was titled "Autistic Disorder" and was much narrower in scope.

SD#53 is now only counting "G" designations that would have been designated under the previous narrower category, circa 2002.



### The result?

Of the current 143 students with a "G" designation in our district, only 62 will be counted in remedy calculations.

This reduction in "G" designations has resulted in a reduction in remedy of approximately 50% from last year.

Funding of these children remain the same, just the teachers' possible remedy calculation was lost. This was a loss for the BCTF.

# What is the criteria for counting "G" students for the purpose of class composition?

If there is an Autism Spectrum Disorder diagnosis under the DSM-5, all of the following DSM-5 criteria are met:

- A) Marked deficits in verbal and non-verbal social communication skills (Level 2 Social Communication Severity);
- B) And an accompanying intellectual impairment (FSIQ = <70- CatK; (MID)
- C) And an accompanying language impairment.

If there is a concern about a student's classification in the Autism category, please ask your CIT / school-based team. Files can be reviewed.
